



Biography: Roger Haley, Chair

Roger, a Director of the CPHC Board since June 2014, was elected Chair at the Annual General Meeting on June 27, 2018, following a 2-year term as Vice-Chair of the Board.

Roger came to CPHC in 2014 while employed as a Staff Representative and Negotiator for the Ontario Public Service Employees Union (OPSEU) since 1989.
